The Music Club was set up in 2010 to support children with disabilities and special needs and their families. We believe in the power of music to bring people together. We also believe in the joy and fun music brings to the life of children and families living with disabilities.

We understand that music can also help in the overall development and well being of children and young people with learning disabilities. This club aims to provide a place where families can feel supported and where children and young people develop social, creative, emotional, mental and communication skills.











The Music Club Committee

The club is managed by a committee of 5 members Sophia Nicholls, Sally Tallent, Omera Waheec, Alice Cooper and Julie Hinton. As parents with children or relatives with special needs, we understand the needs of the membership. We meet monthly to plan the year and discuss future projects.

All Changed in 2018!

Sometimes change can be unnerving and disruptive but for the Music Club change has been for the better! We experienced three major changes in 2018.

First Change

Last year (Dec 2017) we were requested by the Crowmarsh Village Hall committee to find another venue as they required the hall for the local Beaver club. This was initially a big challenge for The Music Club as we were concerned about the effect the change would have on our members. **We are pleased to say that the move created a number of opportunities.** We now meet at the **Woodcote Village Hall** Reading Rd, Reading RG8 0SD. The attendance has increased significantly with an average of 30 - 40 people in attendance at our monthly events.

Second Change

We now meet on a **Sunday with one or two sessions on a Monday**. (see the dates below). Meeting on Sunday has allowed an increase in families to be able to access our events. The evenings were becoming difficult for some families with small children and also for those needing to get children to bed on time. Sunday has also allowed for the whole family to attend as some families have to work away in the week.

Third Change

The Music Club now meets in the afternoon at 2pm - 4pm. This new time offers the Music club more opportunities such as longer timing for the music workshops and more time for families to get to know each other. Our Carers now have more time to spend sharing experiences and gaining confidence in peer support. We are planning to have a Carer's meal later in the year. WATCH THIS SPACE.

Fundraising in 2018

It the beginning of the year, the committee recognised the need to raise significant funds to help keep the club on a sustainable footing. We would like to thank the following organisations for awarding the music club funds in 2018 for work in 2018 / 2019.







In October / November 2018 we were awarded just over £7,200 from Awards for All, National Lottery. Thanks to Sara and Omera for their input in securing these funds.

In November we received £2,000 from the Coop grant making arm of the organisation. Thanks to Alison for her efforts in securing these funds In September 2018 we received £500 from Skipton and £240 from Waitrose thanks to Julie and Sophia for their efforts in securing these funds.

We thank Benson for awarding £200 towards our work.

Thanks also to all our club members for individual contributions - from birthday parties and other fundraising activities.

In total, we have been able to secure just over £9,000 in 2018 which will enable us to continue the work of the music club. The club aims to address issues of social isolation, exclusion and lack of services for children and young people with learning disabilities.

Next year, we would like to make a few more changes to the way we administer the club to ensure we can help our families avoid the challenges of isolation and exclusion. We are keen to establish sustainable and more secure systems and we really need your help to make this happen.

- 1. In 2019, we will be making a **small charge to families for membership**. This will enable us to work towards a sustainable future for the club. The membership fee will enable members to continue to received <u>discounted fees</u> to the events and outings organised by the club, It will also go towards the <u>cost of the workshops</u> and other projects and resources provided by the club.
